The dialogue between Philip and Angus and their different paths will provide the central theme for the evening, with excellent opportunity for audience participation.



Philip Roderick is founder-director of The Quiet Garden Movement, a simple ministry of hospitality, prayer and beauty, now with over 280 affiliated centres on 5 continents. He is also an Anglican priest, musician, and leads *Contemplative Fire: creating a community of Christ at the edge*. Philip guides workshops internationally on creative imagination, contemplative theology, Celtic Christian spirituality and the intricacy and wonder of the natural world. He has published a book, CD and DVD.



Angus Jenkinson is author of *From Stress to Serenity, Gaining Strength in the Trials of Life*. He is a professor of marketing, researcher, artist-photographer and writer who has engaged deeply with the work of Rudolf Steiner for over 30 years as part of a broad path of personal development.
